'GIDEON MANTELL'S TIME IN LEWES AND SOME OF HIS IMPORTANT FINDS'.

Many people know about Gideon Mantell and his fossil finds which eventually resulted in him identifying and publicising the existence of Iguanodon, one of the first dinosaurs to be named and described. People, however, often know less about his many antiquarian and natural history interests. Debby Matthews will highlight these in her talk, with an emphasis on what he found in and around Lewes.

Interest in Mantell

Debby's interest in Mantell arose from finding out that he had been born in her house on Station Street in 1790. She studied history at Sussex University in the School of Cultural and Community Studies and has always had a keen interest in anything historic so this was a happy opportunity to drop into her lap.

She is currently working on a history of Station Street with support from the Lewes History Group, book due out soon. Before retiring in 2024, Debby had worked at the Lewes Tourist Information Centre for nine years.
